



OUR SERVICES

DETOX

For many ATS clients, freeing their bodies of addictive substances is the first step towards a successful recovery.

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT

Gender-specific residents learn and live together to understand underlying causes of addiction.

RECOVERY HOMES

Long-term recovery is supported by continued structure in safe and sober transition environments.

OUTPATIENT SERVICES

Former residential clients are given the tools to succeed, knowing that recovery is a journey – not a goal.

TREATMENT GROUPS

We offer extension groups in trauma recovery, anger management, personal growth, relapse prevention, and more. You may enroll in any treatment group during or outside of other ATS programs.

ASSESSMENTS

Get treatment recommendations, set up a consultation, seek testing, and more. You don't have to be enrolled in an ATS program or other service to explore our assessment options.

THERAPY/COUNSELING

If you're looking for a more intensive treatment plan that continues as you move on in your recovery and engage with your community, we work with you to set a program and schedule that fits.

ADAM'S STORY

My journey with substance use disorder spanned nearly 15 years of my life and involved jails, institutions, homelessness, unemployment, loss of relationships with family and friends and many unintended health and social consequences; some of which I am still trying to rectify to this day. After more than a dozen times in treatment, I felt defeated and was dealing with the diminished ability to deal with life on its own terms and the only consequences I had left to face because of my addiction were prison and death.


This is where Addiction Treatment Services came in. As my 14th and final treatment center, ATS showed me what it meant to be an active participant in my own recovery. Taking me in at my lowest point, the incredible therapists and staff taught me so much and for the first time since I began using drugs, I had a life worth living. I was finally on a strong recovery program to help me stay on this new path I found to sustain recovery and clean time.

After committing to my sobriety, ATS took a chance and hired me in 2022. This was the first time in nearly 10 years I had a job that was allowing me to use my degree. I now have a career where I am encouraged to advance through trainings and I get to share the gift of recovery with others every day, like it was so freely shared with me.

All the things that I have in my life that I didn't have when I was in active addiction — a loving partner, being reunited with my son, having a relationship with my parents, getting to be a productive member of society— I owe to Addiction Treatment Services for helping me find my path.

At every level of the organization, from the executive team to recovery navigators, ATS puts the care of clients and their well-being first. Also at every level, there are team members on their own recovery paths who understand exactly what clients are going through and can provide individualized care and situational understanding better than anyone else. This makes our team experts on helping each client find a recovery path that works for them. The exposure to these multiple pathways and levels of care for clients through detox, residential treatment, recovery housing and outpatient care right in Grand Traverse County, creates an unmatched experience and is what sets ATS apart from other organizations.

Personally, and professionally, I am constantly working on myself to be the best person, employee, partner and father I can possibly be. Addiction Treatment Services means everything to me and I look forward to coming to work and making a difference daily.

OUR FACILITIES

We pair clinical treatment with community support to provide clients with the strength to overcome addiction. Whether being cared for during detox or gathering with peers who understand, ATS offers clients a place to turn when they need it most. All of our facilities are staffed by compassionate and qualified individuals whose common focus on hope helps our clients thrive.

The P.I.E.R. Withdrawal Management

Assisting those wishing to medically detox from alcohol and/or opiates, as well as coordination of care to recovery services.

Dakoske Hall

This is a four-week men's residential program focusing on treating the whole person, including physical, mental, emotional and social health. Clients are provided with individual therapy, group therapy, relapse prevention, life skills and medical assistance.

Health Clinic

Medical Care, Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT), Psychiatry, Case Management, Peer Coaches and Specialty Referrals.

Phoenix Hall

Our women's residential program provides safe and caring support for our female clients including pregnant women and women with children who are struggling with substance abuse. Here they discover a path to recovery through emotional management and relationship building.

Recovery Housing

Transitional housing options for men and women in the city of Traverse City. Participation in ATS outpatient services is required.

The P.O.R.C.H.

A vibrant gathering place created to strengthen community health, clients engage in all-inclusive peer support, real time resources, and social activities that reflect all pathways to recovery.

Intensive Outpatient Programming

Telehealth services for groups and individual sessions with a therapist. Not limited to ATS clients.

Outpatient Therapy Services

Individual substance use and occurring mental health therapy sessions (telehealth and in-person). Not limited to ATS clients.

Family Road to Recovery

Bi-weekly telehealth and in-person group to educate family members of those facing Substance Use Disorder. Individual meetings with a Family Support Specialist are offered.

Coping with Anger

A 12-week telehealth group for men and women to address coping mechanisms for anger.

OUR DONORS


